Early work and monumental commissions

During my academy years at the Moller Institute in Tilburg and the Gerrit Rietveldacademy in Amsterdam, I focused on spatial work with textiles Already as an young artist the participation in material-related international events such as in Lódz, Kyoto and Beijing made me well-known in many countries. In the Netherlands, I have carried out monumental commissions as large as 250 m² such as the ornamental cloth for theatre De Spiegel in Zwolle, Magic Wall and reception area head office of Royal TenCate and Cascade curtains for the City Hall in Almelo, which continue the exploration of new materials within my textile works.

At the National Museum of Modern Art in Kyoto (MoMAK) in 2007, I was given free rein to exhibit solo in a large museum hall. A white artificial grass carpet proved to invite visitors to stay long and relaxed, danced and pay more concentrated attention to the sculptures of rubber, lacquer, gold leaf and cowhides in the room. Such reactions from theaudience had not been seen there before.
